4. Being Resilient and Reflective

In line with the desired Traits of MFPS Students, we would like to remind our students, staff and parents to continue to be Empowered Learners and Empathetic Leaders who are resilient problem solvers reflecting on and learning from their experiences. We hope our students, staff and parents will continue to be resilient and persevere amidst challenges as they work hard to achieve their goals and see challenges as opportunities to learn. We will continue to nurture students emphasising on the learning disposition, persisting, in teaching our students to stay resilient and reflective and to face life's challenges with courage, patience and not give up. In this we hope that our parents and guardians will continue to support and encourage resilience and reflection at home too.

5. School Curriculum Hours

Punctuality remains a core value and life-long habit we want to inculcate in our students so that they are better prepared for learning through the rich learning experiences the school provides for each child. Please ensure that your child / ward gets sufficient sleep every night and reaches school and be in the hall / classroom before 7.30 am for the flag-raising and pledge-taking ceremony.

Students are considered late for school if they are unable to join their classes at 7.30 am for the flag-raising ceremony. The school monitors those who come late and misses the flag raising ceremony with their classes. Do note that the conduct grades of students who are recalcitrant late comers will be reviewed.

Silent Reading Before Morning Assembly

To inculcate a love for reading from a young age, all MFPS students will start their day at school with silent reading. Kindly ensure that your child brings the reading materials appropriate for his / her reading level (these should not include comic books), in his / her Mother Tongue language on Mondays and Tuesdays and in English language on the other three days of the week.

Dismissal

To further ensure the safe dismissal of our P1 and P2 students, they will be brought by their subject teachers to their respective dismissal points. The school does not allow P1 and P2 students to go home on their own. They are either to be picked up by parents / caregivers or take the school bus.

However, do note the following arrangement for the P1s and P2s on these dates :

P1: From 3 January to 31 January 2023, all P1s will be dismissed at 1.20 pm.

P2: From 4 to 6 January 2023, all P2s will be dismissed at 1.25 pm.

Parents / caregivers are to wait for their child / ward at the dismissal points at gates C or D. These dismissal points will be demarcated with signs. Parents and guardians are not to proceed beyond these demarcated areas.

Snack break

Students are given a 10-minute snack break daily. We seek your cooperation in ensuring that your child / ward brings along a snack which should be something healthy, convenient and easy for your child / ward to consume during the short break.

6. Absence from school

All students are expected to be present and to attend lessons and all school activities such as tests, examinations or learning experiences that have been planned for them.

Students who are frequently absent regardless of whether they have a valid reason, would fall behind in their studies. If your child / ward is absent from school due to **medical or compassionate reasons**, you are required to provide the Form / Co-Form Teacher with a medical certificate or letter.

Do note that teachers are not obliged to provide students with the materials, tests or examinations they missed without valid reasons. Parents / guardians are to consult the Form Teacher or Year Head for advice in advance on this.

Permission has to be sought from the Principal in writing, if your child / ward has to leave school for any overseas trips during the school term. Please send in your request through the Year Heads.

7. Safe Management Measures (SMM) and Health Matters

Although SMMs have been relaxed, we will continue to be vigilant and continue to emphasise the importance of personal hygiene and social responsibility:

- Your child is encouraged to keep his / her oral digital thermometer (ODT) in his / her school bag daily. Do ensure that it is in working condition. If your child / ward has misplaced his / her ODT or if it is faulty, you may purchase one from the school bookshop. The ODT is an essential item to be brought to school each day. This would also train the students for the

semesterly **Temperature Taking Exercise** conducted by MOE which would be **held on Wednesday**, **11 January 2023** for Semester 1. Do note that there will be a **familiarisation exercise on 5 and 6 January 2023** for students to be familiar with the use of the ODT and to check that students have a thermometer that is in working condition.

- Currently it is optional for students to wear face masks in school. However, it would be good practice to keep a mask in a Ziploc or plastic bag should your child need one.
- As part of the students' VIA and good habit inculcation, students will perform a wipe down routine when there is a change of venue, during recess and at the end of each day.
- The school will continue with staggered recess to enable students to have more time to eat and play.

As part of social responsibility, students should not report to school if:

- they tested positive for Covid-19.
- they have fever or flu-like symptoms.

Safeguarding the health and well-being of our students is our collective responsibility. We seek your cooperation to seek medical attention for your child / ward should he / she develop flu-like symptoms and keep him / her away from school until he / she has fully recovered.

8. Use of Mobile Phones in School

To create a conducive and focused learning environment in school, students are strongly discouraged from bringing their mobile phones to school. Students who need to call their parents / guardians are to seek assistance from staff in the general office. Please refer to *Annex A* on *MFPS Policy on the Use of Mobile Phones* for further details.

9. Safety of Students in the School

The safety and security of all our students are of high importance. Hence all visitors to the school throughout the day are to report to the Guard House to register their visit so that we have a record of visitors on the school grounds at all times. Please refer to *Annex B on School Safety Matters* for more details. We seek your support and cooperation in ensuring that the school will continue to be a safe, secure and conducive learning environment for all our students.

The school has also as part of MOE's safety measures installed a turnstile at Gate D. More information will be provided to students when the system is in operation.

12. Home-School Collaboration

You will receive via Parents' Gateway a letter from your child's Form Teachers introducing themselves, the subject teachers, as well as the Year Head overseeing the pastoral care and well-being of the cohort. Their respective email addresses will be reflected in the notification. You may communicate with the teachers via email or pen messages in the Student Handbook. Do note that **teachers are not required to give their personal contact number to parents**. As our staff have duties and training they may have to attend to in addition to their teaching duties, please give them a few days to respond to you. We seek your understanding to refrain from contacting the teachers outside working hours (from 6 pm to 6.30 am on weekdays, and on weekends and public holidays). To ensure that the staff you would like to meet is available, parents / guardians are requested to make prior appointments. In addition, you may contact the school via the school email address mayflower_ps@moe.edu.sg or call the General Office at 64520849 during office hours (8 am to 5 pm) from Mondays to Fridays to make the appointments or leave a message. Do note that except in special cases, parents / guardians should not make appointments with teachers during curriculum time as they have classes to teach.

While our staff will attend to you and assist you to their best ability, we request that parents / guardians treat our staff with due respect.

Research has shown that when parents are involved in nurturing their child's social and emotional competencies, children are likely to improve academically, have greater enthusiasm for learning and experience increased self-esteem and responsibility towards others. As parents play an important role in their child's growth, your child will benefit most when both the school and home place the child at the heart of what we do and when we understand our shared responsibilities for your child and work together to bring out the best in your child. Working in partnership with us will help you to better understand your child's learning experience in school, so that you can provide your child the necessary family care, support and reinforcement at home. We must be mindful though that supporting is different from over indulgence and being over protective of them.

On this note, as part of each child's learning process, we would also like parent's support in working with us to inculcate independence and personal responsibility. Do note that **the school no longer entertains requests from parents / guardians to hand over forgotten items (except medication) and homework to their children in school.** Let us teach our children this important lifeskill of taking personal responsibility and ownership of their own things. We look forward to working with you to develop your child to be the best that he or she can be.

We encourage and invite you to join the MFPS Parents Support Group or sign up as parent volunteers so that you can be involved with the various school activities that take place throughout the year. If you would like to support our school in other ways, please contact us.

13. Class Administration

a. First Day of School

For Primary 1 students, parents can accompany the student to school on 3 January to attend the P1 briefing. Please refer to the Parent Guidebook for more information on what to pack for your child/ward for the first day of school [URL: https://sites.google.com/moe.edu.sg/mfpsp1/parent-guidebook]. We seek your understanding to bring your own water as the canteen stalls will only sell food / drinks to students and staff.

Primary 1 to Primary 6 students will need to bring a pair of scissors, glue and colouring materials for the first 2 days of school.

b. Updating of Student Details and Parent Information by 31 January 2023

With effect from January 2023, parents / legal guardian will be able to update their own particulars and their child's / ward's information by logging in to the Student Details Form (SDF) via Singpass. Authorised caregiver will only be able to update his / her own particulars.

The SDF is the digitalisation of the Pupil Data Form (PDF) and the Individual Student Details Report (ISDR). Parents / legal guardians can provide both sets of data in a single session when they log into the SDF portal. (MOE will provide parents / legal guardians with the link to login to SDF at the beginning of 2023.)

Parents / legal guardians who are unable to access the SDF are to inform the school via their child's Form Teacher and the school will print a hard copy for parents / legal guardian to verify.

c. Labelling books and other personal belongings

Please assist to label your child's books and personal belongings such as school uniform, water bottles, pencil cases, wallets, purses, etc., with their full names and class so that should your child's lost item be found, it can be returned.

14. Personal Data Protection Act (PDPA)

Photographs or video images of you and your child / ward may be taken during school activities and events such as classroom lessons, CCA, school camps, or school concerts. The school may use and publish such photographs or video recordings in school publications, the school's website, social media channels, or other communication channels.

If you do not wish to have you or your child/ward featured in our publications, please write in to the school to inform us.

Annex A - MFPS Policy on the Use of Mobile Phones / Smart Watches in School

We recognise that mobile phones and smart watches are part of everyday life for many children and that they can provide a useful means of communication between them and their family members. However, they can prove to be a great distraction in students' learning. Therefore, students are strongly discouraged from bringing mobile phones or smart watches to school or on learning journeys.

If a parent or guardian would like his / her child to bring a mobile phone or smart watch to school, please contact the child's Form Teacher to communicate the need. The child's Form Teacher will advise the parent / guardian accordingly and issue an application form for completion. If the request is successful, the child will be given a school sticker which is to be pasted at the back of the mobile phone / smart watch. **This approval is only valid for the year of application.** Please note that parents are strongly advised to go through the guidelines with their children before letting them bring the mobile phone to school.

Students are expected to follow the school's guidelines on bringing and using the mobile phone / smart watch in school. The school will not be held responsible for the loss or damage of mobile phones / smart watches brought to school. Mobile phones / smart watches brought to school without permission (i.e. no written request submitted) or used outside school guidelines will be confiscated and parents will be required to collect them personally from the teacher.

Smart watches will not be allowed into examination venues during national exams as well as school-based exams.

Should students need to contact their parent / guardian when they are in school, they can seek assistance from the general office staff. On learning journeys outside the school, students can approach the teachers-in-charge for help if they need to contact their parents.

For parents who prepare lunch for their children for after school activities, please make the necessary arrangements with your children to collect the lunch boxes from you at the school gates after dismissal. Students are not allowed to leave the school premises after curriculum hours if they are involved in any after school activities. We seek your kind understanding and cooperation not to come into the school grounds for these purposes.

Road Safety

We would like to seek your cooperation to work with the school in ensuring the safety of students coming to and leaving school as our young children may not have the skills required to use roads properly and do not always fully appreciate the dangers presented.

Please note there shall be strictly NO PARKING, where applicable:

- Within 9 metres of a bus stop;
- Within 6 metres of a traffic junction;
- Within 50 metres of a pedestrian crossing;
- Along roads with double yellow lines;
- On grass verge and footway; and
- At entrances or exits of any other premises.

Hence, you are encouraged to park your vehicles at the nearby public car park at **Block 150** when picking your child at dismissal.

The National Environment Agency (NEA) would like to remind parents to switch off their vehicles' engine while waiting to pick their children from school to achieve better air quality and safeguard public health. A stationary motor vehicle with engine running, wastes fuel and causes air pollution.

School Bus

We constantly remind students who take the school bus to put on their seat belts at all times on the bus. We seek your cooperation to reinforce this message at home for their safety.

Walking to / from school:

For the safety of children who walk to school, you are strongly encouraged to have an adult accompany and supervise them at all times.

Cycling to / from school:

We have noticed that a handful of our students either cycle or are cycled to and from school. We would strongly discourage students cycling to school unless accompanied by a responsible adult. Please adhere to the following guidelines by the Traffic Police when you are cycling your child to / from school.

- a. Wear a suitable protective bicycle helmet at all times to safeguard against head injuries should one fall
- b. Abide by road traffic rules at all times and adopt safe cycling behaviour and habits.
- c. Avoid cycling along the footpaths. If there is a need to cycle on the pedestrian pathway, please dismount from your bicycle and walk with your child.
- d. Practice the kerb drill "Look Right. Look Left. Look Right again!" to ensure that it is safe to cross the roads at traffic light junctions and zebra crossings.

We seek your support and cooperation so that your child will be safe travelling to and from school and that the school environment will be safe and secure in the face of possible security threats. We expect some inconvenience on your part due to having to adjust to these enhanced measures and ask for your patience and understanding in this move taken by the school.





MESSAGE FROM LTA ON ROAD SAFETY OF STUDENTS

We would like to seek your cooperation to work with the school in ensuring the safety of students coming to and leaving school.

This letter reiterates the road safety policies of the school:

- a. Reduce vehicle speed and stay alert for pedestrians in the school zone.
- b. <u>Cooperate</u> with traffic marshals to ensure overall safety and smooth traffic flow.
- c. Let your child alight only at the designated drop-off point.
- d. Be advised not to violate traffic rules by driving recklessly or making illegal manoeuvres such as turning into the school from the outer lane(s) of the road.
- e. Do not horn indiscriminately.
- f. Help your child alight from the car as quickly as possible.
- g. Reinforce <u>correct road safety behaviour</u> such as using the pedestrian crossing, and avoiding jaywalking or using a handphone while crossing.
- h. Remind your children to practice the <u>kerb drill</u> before crossing "look right, look left, look right again, ensure all vehicles have stopped, raise your hand high up and cross the road briskly".
- i. If your child <u>must</u> cycle to school, ensure that he knows safe cycling rules and is a competent cyclist.

For the safety of everyone, enforcement action will be taken against motorists who violate traffic rules. We thank all parents and guardians who have been good role models for our children.
